<b>Poured Through</b> <i>God calls believers to be channels of His grace to others.</i>	<b>Eph 4:29-32; 5:1-2</b> <b>Matthew 12:33-37</b> <i>Gracious words and deeds start in the heart.</i>	<b>Eph 5:21-31; 6:1-9</b> <i>God describes how His people can show grace in all our relationships.</i>	<b>Philippians 2:1-11</b> <i>A truly gracious attitude<sup>1</sup> reflects the attitude of Christ.</i>	<b>Romans 12:9-18</b> <b>1 Cor 13:4-8</b> <i>Gracious behavior can be described as agape love in action.</i>	<b>1 Cor 9:19-23</b> <b>Colossians 4:2-6</b> <i>A gracious witness connects with others and honors Jesus.</i>
<b>Overflowing</b> <i>God’s grace floods our lives during times of trial.</i>	<b>2 Cor 1:3-11</b> <i>Our gracious God comforts us in trials through His people &amp; His Spirit.</i>	<b>2 Cor 12:1-10</b> <i>God may not change our circumstances, but He always strengthens us with His grace.</i>	<b>Phil 4:10-13</b> <b>Eph 3:13-21</b> <i>In all circumstances, God’s overflowing grace does immeasurably more!</i>	<b>2 Cor 4:5-18</b> <i>God graciously uses our trials as a testimony to others.</i>	<b>2 Timothy 4:6-8</b> <i>Paul’s last written words reflect a lifetime of God’s lavish grace!</i>
